

# Bibliographic References

## References in text

- In-text citations are placed in parentheses using the Author-Date system (e.g., Aharoni 1979: 25–54).
- After the year, use colon (not comma), followed by a space before the page numbers.
- Page numbers are given in full (e.g., 159–173 and not 159–73).
- Three authors: specify all surnames. Use “and” (not &) and no comma before the last item (e.g., Arie, Rosen and Namdar 2020).
- Four authors or more: write *et al.* in the text (e.g., Gadot *et al.* 2014; Lipschits *et al.* 2021), but all names should be detailed in the reference list.
- All references are separated by semicolon (e.g., Na’aman 2007; 2021; Finkelstein 2013: 100–123).

## Reference list

- All bibliographical material should be placed in a Reference list at the end of the article. Only include bibliographical items that are referred to in the text.
- No space between an author’s initials (e.g., Stiebel, G.D.).
- Titles in English: all words should be capitalized except prepositions (e.g., to, from, on, of) and conjunctions (and, but). Note that pronouns (e.g., Its, Their) should be capitalized.
- Capitalization of titles in other languages should follow the capitalization rules for those languages.
- Titles of books and journals should be italicized. Titles of articles and chapters should not be italicized and should not be marked with quotation marks.
- Give title of periodicals in full, unless they appear in *Tel Aviv*’s List of Abbreviations (see below).
- Journal volumes and issues: in the event that page numbers are consecutive between issues, omit issue number.
- Do not include the publishers’ name.
- Online publications: provide a stable link (e.g., DOI) if possible, and date of access; format: (accessed on DD Month, year).
- If the publication cited is in Hebrew or Arabic, a translation of the title (as indicated in the original publication) should be given, and the language should be specified in parentheses. If the publication includes an English summary, give the page number of the summary as well: Dothan, T. 2003. A Decorated Ivory Lid from Tel Miqne-Ekron. *Eretz-Israel* 27: 83–90 (Hebrew), 285\*–286\* (English summary).
